All of LeapFrog's infant and toddler products are created with baby's cognitive development in mind. We have identified 6 essential developmental skills that contribute to baby's future learning success!



### PROBLEM SOLVING (Birth +)

From birth, babies are constantly experimenting with their worlds – a developmental process we find absolutely fascinating! Accidental discoveries progress to more purposeful actions, and at around 8 months, babies become active problem solvers who want to reach goals and who understand that actions cause reactions. Babies will repeat their “experiments” over and over, particularly if they are rewarded with a pleasing response!



### LANGUAGE (Birth +)

Hearing speech is important because it helps newborns become familiar with useful language sounds. In the first year, babies progressively develop the ability to produce the sounds of speech – crying, cooing, babbling, and eventually repetition of multiple syllables. By 6 months, babies begin to slowly figure out what certain sound strings mean and by 12 months may consistently string sounds together, purposefully imitating and replicating sounds. Beyond 12 months, children progressively build vocabulary, typically with two-word combinations, and begin to learn the principles of word order and the unwritten rules of when and how to speak.



### MEMORY (3 Months +)

Basic memory skills become evident in babies at around 3 months, when they begin to remember where a hidden object is located. Crawling and cruising begin the process of cognitive mapping (experiencing elements of space from different vantage points) and babies begin to remember where things are! By 12 months, children may be able to retain in memory a specific sequence for 3 or more behaviors, words and events. Eventually, babies develop a memory of events and feelings that were personally experienced – “autobiographical memory” begins!



### EARLY MATH (6 Months +)

As early as 6 months, babies can begin to understand the concept of number, noticing small groups of one, two or three things. Beginning around 12 months, a child can benefit from exposure to the comparison of amounts, such as “Which cup holds more juice?” At around 18 months, as language skills develop, some toddlers can recite number names in order and begin to count things. Other important math skills include recognition of shapes and their names – mathematical ideas basic to geometry and trigonometry!



### EARLY READING (6 Months +)

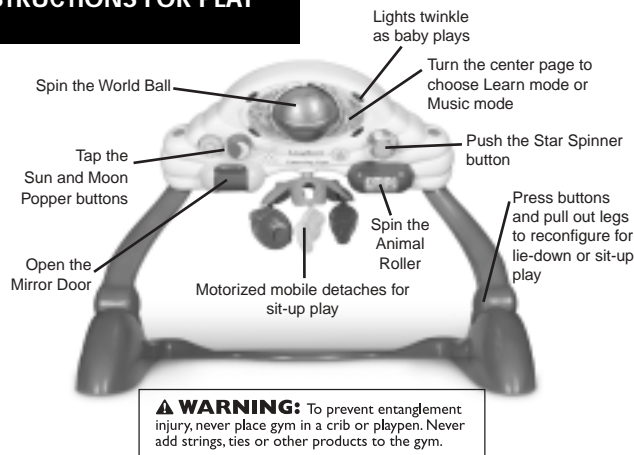
You'll be amazed at the results if you begin reading to your baby early and regularly! Positive early-reading experiences can help children develop a great enthusiasm toward books. At around 9 months, a child may begin to understand that text proceeds from left to right on a page. As a result, at around 12 months, a child may begin to recognize that words are made up of sounds that can be combined in different ways to form different words. Soon, a child will begin to recognize letters and produce letter names, eventually sounding out each letter.



### CREATIVE THINKING (9 Months +)

Very early in a baby's life, parents or caregivers can play funny sound and face games to begin to spark baby's imagination. After the age of 9 months, babies become fascinated with learning about objects and begin to experiment, interacting with objects in new and creative ways, just to see what happens! Beyond 12 months, as imagination grows, pretend play becomes more real and complex. After 18 months, creativity with words, music and drawing all begin to emerge, eventually leading to the ability to creatively overcome obstacles – an important skill in life!


### Configuring the LEAPSTART™ Learning Gym for play

Refer to the included "Assembly and Use Instructions" for detailed information about how to assemble and use the LEAPSTART Learning Gym. Be sure to save these instructions for future reference.

The LEAPSTART Learning Gym may be configured for younger infants to lie on the floor, or for older infants who are able to sit on their own. Use as a sit-up toy only when your child is able to sit steadily. For lie-down play, attach the mobile to the Gym. For sit-up play, ALWAYS DETACH THE MOBILE. As with all toys for this age group, adult supervision is required.

**WARNING:** The mobile is not a toy when removed from the product. Store in a safe place away from children.

### Getting Started

Turn on the LEAPSTART Learning Gym by switching the selector located on the back of the unit from "Off" to  (lie-down play) or  (sitting play).

### Lie-down play:

Referring to the "Assembly and Use Instructions," configure the Gym into the lie-down play position and attach the mobile. Any activity on the Gym will start the music.

Turn the **center page** to **Learn mode**.


- As the mobile turns, baby will hear a "Hello World Song" which introduces how children around the world say "hello!" In French, "bonjour!" In German, "guten tag!" In Spanish, "¡hola!" In Japanese, "konichiwa!"

Turn the **center page** to **Music mode**.

- As the mobile turns, baby will hear over 10 minutes of melodies from around the world – African, French, Latin, Irish and American rhythms.

### Sitting play:

Referring to the "Assembly and Use Instructions," configure the Gym into sitting position and **DETACH THE MOBILE**.

**Special note:** If you select  mode for sitting play, melodies and songs will play along with the hands-on activities!



Turn the **center page** to **Learn Mode**.

- **World Ball:** Spin to hear "hello" in 5 different languages.
- **Mirror Door:** Open to hear "Peekaboo! I see you!"
- **Animal Roller:** Roll to hear animal names, colors and counting 1-5.
- **Sun and Moon Popper:** Press for opposites – "Sun"/"Moon," "Day"/"Night" or "Good Morning"/"Good Night."
- **Star Spinner:** Push to hear counting 1-5 in five languages (English, Spanish, French, German or Japanese).

Turn the **center page** to **Music Mode**.

- **World Ball:** Spin to hear a brief instrumental melody.
- **Mirror Door:** Open to hear a world vocal chorus.
- **Animal Roller:** Roll to hear a fun melody for each animal.
- **Sun and Moon Popper:** Press for contrasting musical phrases – high/low, fast/slow.
- **Star Spinner:** Push to hear stanzas of Mozart's "Eine Kleine Nacht Musik."

### Volume Control:

Press the  button located on the back of the unit to increase the volume or press the  button to decrease volume. The volume will stay at the same level you last selected each time you turn on the product.

### Battery Information:

Requires 4 AA (called LR6 in some countries) alkaline batteries, not included.

### Battery Safety:

Batteries are small objects. Replacement of batteries must be done by adults. Follow the polarity (+/-) diagram in the battery compartment. Promptly remove dead batteries from the toy. Dispose of used batteries properly. Only batteries of the same or equivalent type as recommended are to be used.

DO NOT incinerate used batteries.

DO NOT dispose of batteries in fire, as batteries may explode or leak.

DO NOT mix old and new batteries or types of batteries (i.e. alkaline/standard).

DO NOT use rechargeable batteries.

DO NOT recharge non-rechargeable batteries.

DO NOT short-circuit the supply terminals.

### Battery Installation:

1. Requires 4 AA (called LR6 in some countries) alkaline batteries.
2. Open the battery door with a screwdriver.
3. Install new batteries as shown in the polarity diagram (+/-) inside the battery compartment.
4. Replace battery door securely.
