Exploring the Learning Path



LeapFrog's Learning Path is driven by LeapFrog's Scope and Sequence. Developed by educators in conjunction with state curriculum standards, LeapFrog's Scope and Sequence is a database of skills your child will encounter at various stages in their education.

Each of the stepping stones on the path is a general skill area for your child's grade level. From Spelling to Creativity, all general skills are represented by a stone in your child's path.



Exploring the Learning Path



The colors of the stepping stones each represent a different subject, like Social Studies or Science.

If a stepping stone is colored, it means that your child has a LeapFrog product that teaches this subject.

If a stepping stone has a footprint icon on it, it means that your child is engaged in at least one of the skills in this subject area.

Star icons indicate that your child has engaged with every skill within the subject area.

Shooting star icons indicate that your child has engaged with a skill above their age or grade level.

Information in your child's learning path is updated every time their LeapFrog Connected device is connected to the computer, or when you update your child's Learning Path with a new LeapFrog product.
